


Those members that have not renewed their membership after one-year of billing, monthly, have been deleted from the data base.





Previous Board Meeting Minutes Approval. Motion by Bill Mathis, seconded by James Harvey, to approve the minutes of April 14, 2022, May 10, 2022, and July 21, 2022, and the Special Meeting on September 22, 2022. Passed.

The meeting was called to order by Ruben Alejandro, President Reports:

- 1. Reviewed membership totals and recruitment strategies.
- 2. Reviewed billing strategies and alternatives to the current monthly billing cycle.
